aydn wrote "The Creation" in 1798 when he was 66. He had been deeply affected by hearing several of Handel's oratorios, including "The Messiah" and aspired to write his first oratorio to express his profoundly religious feelings.

The orchestral introduction to "The Creation" is a tone poem depicting chaos being resolved into order, darkness into light. The role of the Narrator is divided among the three archangels, Raphael, Uriel and Gabriel, who not only proclaim the biblical words, but also in the arias which intersperse the narrative recitatives, describe the various creative acts in poetic imagery. Haydn vividly depicted events and characteristics of nature in an abundance of finely observed detail representing the meeting of Adam and Eve with the fresh grace of innocent love, and expressed in magnificent choruses the thanksgiving of both angels and humans for the creative works of the Almighty.

Olivier Laquerre, Joseph-Rouleau Award winner, 1st Prize winner at the National Music Festival, youngest finalist at the Paris International Singing Competition and finalist at the Verviers International Singing Competition (Belgium) is presently in the Bachelor's program at McGill University where he entered in 1996 and studies with Jan Simons. Aside from singing in professional choirs, such as the Studio de Musique Ancienne de Montreal and the Montreal Symphony Orchestra, his career as a solo performer is developing very rapidly. He has sung Messiah on several occasions; the Bach Magnificat; the Biber Requiem; Beethoven's 9th., the roles of both Raphael and Adam in the Creation by Haydn, with the McGill Symphony Orchestra; the role of Don Alfonso in Mozart's Cosi fan tutte, the role of Dr. Falke in Johann Strauss' Die Fledermaus and most recently in Handel's Samson.
