KEVIN NIEMAN - Director • DARLENE MILLAR - Accompanist

"For the Relief of the Prisoners in the several Gaols, and for the Support of Mercer's Hospital in Stephen's-street and of the Charitable Infirmary on the Inn's Quay, on Monday the 12th of April, will be performed at the Musick Hall in Fishamble-Street, Mr Handel's new Grand Oratorio, called the Messiah, in which the Gentlemen of the Choirs of both Cathedrals will assist, with some Concertos on the Organ, by Mr Handel." (In this fashion Dublin was introduced to one of the world's most magnificent works. Enjoyment of Music, Machlis, Joseph.)

In 1741, Georg Frederic Handel wrote *MESSIAH* in 24 days to the libretto by Charles Jennens. His servant apparently found him, after he had written the Hallelujah Chorus with tears streaming down his face. "I did think, I did see all Heaven before me, and the great God Himself!" What an astonishing feat, considering Handel never intended MESSIAH to be anything but a commercial venture.

The meditation is more than a collection of biblical scriptures, it is a concise statement of the basic truths of the Christian faith. The *MESSIAH* celebrates the whole of Christ's life. The prophecy of his coming and the foretelling of his birth, in the Hebrew scriptures of Isaiah, to references in the New Testament, of Christ's life and crucifixion are chronicled. The final anthems refer to Revelations and the second coming.

In the beginning, MESSIAH was performed with small baroque orchestras and choirs. It was rescored fifty years later by Mozart, giving the inspiration for larger presentations involving thousands.

Although a religious tradition at Christmas, the world over, Jennens wrote the libretto for Passion Week, the week before Easter, which celebrates the totality of the Christian faith.

Although the intent was to produce an Entertainment for financial gain, the creators of *MESSIAH* gave the world a masterpiece. Of Georg Frederic Handel, Beethoven said, "He was the greatest of us all."

KEVIN NIEMAN, A.Mus. (Perf.) - Choral Director

Kevin is in his 16th year as the Choir's Choral Director. He is an associate of the Western Conservatory of Music, University of Western Ontario. His musical studies have included voice (solo performance), piano, organ, oboe and cello. Kevin has been choir director and choir director/organist for Christ Lutheran Church, Petawawa over the past 26 years, as well as musical director, performer and conductor for the Pembroke Musical Society.

DARLENE MILLAR - Rehearsal Accompanist

Darlene is an accomplished musician who has been associated with many musical organizations including the Pembroke Community Choir, Pembroke Musical Society, and Deep River Symphony Orchestra. Her range of instruments include piano, organ, harpsichord, and percussion. She has 22 years experience as a church organist, and has been the Organist/Choir Director at St. George's Protestant Chapel at CFB Petawawa since 1991. In addition to performing, Darlene enjoys composing and arranging music for piano, voice and woodwind instruments. Darlene and her husband Bob are both avid golfers, and members of the Canadian Ski Patrol.

Christine Murphy - Soprano

Christine Murphy is in her final year of Graduate Studies at McGill University majoring in Opera Performance. Her performances with Opera McGill include Mary Warren from Robert Ward's *The Crucible*, as well as the title role in scenes from Carlisle Floyd's *Susannah*. She received her Bachelor's Degree in Vocal Performance from the Crane School of Music in Potsdam, New York.

Her performances at the Crane School include Mimi in Puccini's *La Bohème*, Mother in Menotti's *Amahl and the Night Visitors*, Ottavia in Monteverdi's *l'Incoronazione di Poppea*, Soprano Soloist in Mozart's *Coronation Mass in C*, and she was a winner of the Crane Annual Concerto Competition. A student of William and Dixie Ross-Neill, she is currently preparing the role of Susanna for Opera McGill's production of *Le Nozze di Figaro*.

Zoe Tarshis - Mezzo-soprano

Zoe Tarshis is currently completing her first year of a Masters degree in Opera Performance at McGill. Zoe has most recently performed the alto solos in *Bach's B Minor Mass* with La Chapelle de Montreal. She has also sung the role of the Angel in Elgar's *The Dream of Gerontius* with the McGill Symphony Orchestra, and performed the role of Nicklausse in Offenbach's *Les Contes d'Hoffmann* with Opera McGill. Zoe recently made her radio debut with the CBC Jeunes Artistes program. With Toronto-based Opera Buffa, she has performed such roles as Zita in Puccini's *Gianni Schicchi* and the Second Lady in Mozart's *The Magic Flute*. Zoe's upcoming performances include *Messiah* with La Chapelle de Montreal in December and the role of Marcellina in Mozart's *Le Nozze di Figaro* with Opera McGill in January.

Sarkis Barsemian - Tenor

Mr. Barsemian has recently completed his Bachelor's degree of Music, majoring in Voice Performance at McGill University. His latest performances in *Les Contes d'Hoffman* at McGill University cast him in four roles as Andres, Frantz, Pitichinaccio and Spalanzani. He has performed the roles of Fenton in *Falstaff*, Count Almaviva in *Il Barbiere di Siviglia*, Prinz Orlofsky in *Die Fledermaus* and Armand de Claval in *Thérèse*. He also performed in the North American premiere of von Suppe's operetta *Zehn Madchen und Kein Mann*. This season he appears with Choeur classique, Ottawa in *Bach's Magnificat*.

Olivier Laquerre - Baritone

Olivier Laquerre is completing his degree at McGill University where he has been working with Jan Simons since 1996. He won the prestigious Joseph Rouleau competition in the spring of 1999. He also won prizes at the Paris and Viviers International voice competitions and first place in the voice category at the National Music Festival in Winnipeg in the summer of 1999. He recently appeared with the Montreal Symphony with song cycles of Maurice Ravel and Hugo Wolf and with the "Studio de musique ancienne de Montreal", singing two secular cantatas by Handel. He has performed the Haydn *Creation*, the Bach *Magnificat*, the Verdi *Requiem*, Handel's *Samson* and *Messiah*, and Beethoven's *9th Symphony*.
