Stella Callighen received a B.Music degree (Mount Allison University, 1977) and has completed courses toward a B.Ed. degree at Memorial University. From 1977 until the family moved to Petawawa National Forestry Institute in December 1992, Stella was a choral music specialist in several primary/elementary schools, and a private voice and piano teacher in her native province, Newfoundland. She has been a soloist with the Newfoundland Symphony Orchestra, CBC Radio and Television and in many musical events in the St. John's region. Since arriving in this area, Stella has been a member of the Cantandos and was a soloist in their recent concert. In November, she was a soloist with The Deep River Choral Group and Symphony Orchestra when they performed Vivaldi's "Gloria". Stella has been replacement conductor of the Pembroke Community Choir since January 1994. She will be a soloist in the Deep River Soiree on May 28. Presently, Stella is teaching voice and piano in Deep River and hopes to begin a children's choir, there, in the fall.
