Written in 1940 at the request of Serge Koussevitsky (Russian-born conductor of the Boston Symphony Orchestra) for the opening of the Berkshire Music Centre.

#### GLORIA / Antonio Vivaldi

#### O COME, O COME, EMMANUEL

Eighteenth century French carol (originally Latin words), using a 15th century French melody.

#### The audience is invited to join the choir in verses 1 & 5:

- 1. O come, O come, Emmanuel! Redeem my captive Israel, That into exile drear is gone; Far from the face of God's dear Son. CHORUS: Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.
- 5. O come, O come, Adonaï, Who in thy glorious majesty From that high mountain clothed with awe gavest thy folk the elder law.

#### O MAGNUM MYSTERIUM / Tomas Luis de Victoria

Many composers set this text concerning the mystery of the birth of Christ to music. Victoria, a Spanish priest, organist and choirmaster, wrote his dramatic setting in the late 16th century.

O great mystery and admirable sacrament, that the animals should witness the birth of the Lord, lowly, in a stable... Alleluia.

#### GESU BAMBINO / Pietro Yon

The Italian-born and trained Yon was organist at St. Francis Xavier Church in New York City when he composed this lovely choral work in 1917.

When blossoms flowered mid the snows, upon a winter night; Was born the Child, the Christmas Rose, the King of love and light...

#### IT CAME UPON THE MIDNIGHT CLEAR

This 19th century carol is set to a traditional English tune, perhaps not the one you are used to. Since David Willcocks arranged it for choir and congregation, please join the choir in verses 2 & 4.

#### NATIVITY CAROL

Both words and music of this and the next carol are by British composer and choral director, John Rutter (b. 1943). Rutter also has his own CD label, Collegium, which he operates from his headquarters in the bottom of his Cambridgeshire garden. It sells 100,000 units in the USA alone each year.

#### THERE CAME A STAR / David Ouchterlony (b. 1914)

This Christmas anthem is by a Canadian composer and musician, once a frequent adjudicator in local Kiwanis Music Festivals.

#### OF THE FATHER'S HEART BEGOTTEN

This ancient carol originally had latin words by the 4th century Prudentius, but we sing it to a late 16th century melody arranged by David Willcocks. The audience is invited to sing verses 5 & 6 with the choir.
